


Goldens were in high demand in 2012 and though it was slower than usual in terms of rescues, over 140 families applied to adopt our Goldens!

Here's a quick look at 2012:



For Top Health, Use Heartworm Preventative Year Round

Heartworm is a serious and often fatal disease that can be avoided with a simple monthly pill. GRRIN urges every dog owner to dispense a monthly heartworm preventative pill, January through December.

If heartworm is transmitted by mosquitoes, and Nebaska is in a deep freez from Thanksgiving through Easter, why bother with year-round medication?



You can't predict the weather, and therefore you can't predict when the danger of mosquitoes is actually gone. Even if it's cold in Nebraska, you might visit an indoor site with your dog, like a dog show, where kennels have traveled from other states carrying insects.



In recent years we've seen a critical national shortage of the medicines used to treat heartworm. In 2012 GRRIN took in a Golden that was heartworm. positive because a local shelter simply had no medicine available to treat the dog. In addition, treatment is expensive and carries risk. It's far safer and more cost-effective to give your dog an inexpensive monthly preventative versus gambling that you'll be able to f nd the costly medicine needed to treat the disease once it's established.



••• Finally, most folks f nd it easier to give the pill each month on a consistent schedule. That way they won't forget to restart the pills as the weather warms up in springtime.

Help your dog stay happy and healthy with year round heartworm prevention!



A Tribute to Toby



Toby came into our lives on May 14, 2005. He was a two year old full of life and adventure. We had lost our golden, Chester to cancer in 2004. Chester w as adopted from GRRIN in the year 2000. We had the idea that Chester was lonely so Razzy came home to them from the GRRIN adoption program. Next, Razzy found her new best friend in Toby. He became Toby 'T' because he was always in 'trouble.' He was described as and energetic and lovable dog with a mischievous side to his personality. Toby lived up to his reputation! Luckily for all of us, he always lived in an environment where he could jump fences and run to the neighbors to get cookies. He started out living in Riv erside Lakes where he learned to swim, w alk in the park, run in the felds and jump into the Elkhorn river for a swim.

Toby spent most of his life living on an acre of waterfront property in Arkansas. He loved the trees in his yard where he and Razzy could chase the squirrels and swim whenever they wanted. Both took long walks in the forest sniff ng and chasing all the little varmints they could f nd. They loved to dig and would come out of the woods with dirt all o ver them. Baths were a must for both. Toby & Razzy loved the boat rides on Lock Lomond Lake.

Toby was great with children, dogs, cats and other people. T oby would greet everyone with a big, deep bark which could be scary if y ou didn't know that he was just a great big ball of fur.

Toby was diagnosed with malignant melanoma in 2011. Our astute v et consulted with K-State Veterinary College, where we had taken Chester for his cancer treatment, to set up a protocol for his procedures. All was going well for Toby for several months until he showed symptoms other than for what he was being treated. Toby fought a valiant f ght against the cancer but lost that battle on May 14, 2012, his 'coming home' date.

We are so blessed to have had Chester and Toby in our lives. We now have our Razzy who is 11 years old and doing so well. She has survived her two best friends and is the sweetest 'puppy.'

We are grateful for the memories and adventures we have had with our GRRIN dogs and are so glad we are able to make their forever homes just right for them.

Toby you are so loved and will be missed forever. Your pictures and memory book will live on in our lives.
