IN MEMORY ACROSS THE RAINBOW BRIDGE



MIRACLE MILO

What can "466" days mean in a dog's life? For Milo it meant strangers stopping to help a Golden in dire need; freedom from a shock collar; medical care; a countless number of people who cared; security in having a safe, comfortable home with regular meals; hugs and puppy massages; gifts from people he would never meet; an extended network of Facebook friends; and trusting humans and believing they are kind.

You may remember Milo became part of the GRRIN family on July 3, 2015 after he was found wandering the streets and fending for himself. Soon after he was brought into GRRIN's care, he became very social. When he saw people he would immediately start walking towards them so they could pet him. He loved being outside and investigating whatever there was to investigate and he was always up for going for a walk! His new found happiness was certainly reflected in his big, beautiful eyes.

Milo crossed the rainbow bridge on October 10th, 2016. He was ever so grateful to have had those "466" days in his life... as the GRRIN humans who cared for him are to have had him in theirs. Our Q4 newsletter is dedicated to our Milo... he definitely was a Miracle Golden.

CANINE CANCER MEMORIAL CANCER STINKS!



Golden retrievers are an amazing, beautiful, friendly, loyal, loving breed of dogs, but they are also a breed that are diagnosed with cancer at a very high rate. In fact, it's been estimated that approximately 60% of Golden Retrievers will be diagnosed with some form of cancer in their lifetime.

This year alone we've lost so many of our beloved GRRIN family to canine cancer. What has been particularly devastating was the recent loss of Madison, one of our rescued dogs from Turkey, to

leukemia. She had very little time to enjoy her stay here in the states before being taken by the disease.

As a response to these astounding stats and our loss of Madison, GRRIN has created a cancer memorial page on our website. This is a place devoted to honoring Goldens that have battled this disease.

There is no denying it, cancer STINKS, but there is some promising news. Morris Animal Foundation is a conducting the very first longitudinal study, the Golden Retriever Lifetime Study, devoted to the issue of Golden Retriever cancer. You can read more about this effort below.

GOLDEN LIFETIME STUDY

The Golden Retriever Lifetime Study, sponsored by Morris Animal Foundation, Blue Buffalo and Petco, is the first of its kind in veterinary medicine. It is both the largest and the longest attempted on canine subjects. The study observes 3,000 Goldens over the course of their full lifetimes to gather insights that can help us prevent and treat cancer in the breed. Participants represent a diverse set of lifestyles and living conditions, and some are even related to track potential genetic concerns.

This lifetime study, "will give [vets] the information they need to make evidence-based recommendations to pet owners so their animals can live longer and healthier lives." Early detection and preventative strategies are the ultimate goals.

Information gathered from this study is believed to have benefits that will reach beyond the Golden breed. Vets leading the study note that results have potential positive impacts for the health of all dogs and even us humans!



REMEMBERING MADISON (16-10)

On May 20th, Madison was brought into GRRIN's care after a long trip from Istanbul, Turkey. Everyone she met loved her, including her wonderful foster mom, Betty, and her caseworker, Pam. She was so lovable in fact that it only took a few months for Madison to have her forever family all lined up.

Unfortunately, Madison's health started to suddenly decline. Betty and Pam worked tirelessly to take her to medical appointments for tests and hoped for a positive outcome. Madison was diagnosed with late-stage leukemia in August and a few weeks later, on September 10th, she crossed the Rainbow Bridge. She was in the loving arms of her new GRRIN family in her final moments.

After living on the streets of Turkey, she had over three months of luxury and comfort with Betty and her Golden Doodle, Rudy. Madison LOVED tennis balls and could be a bit bossy requesting balls to be thrown. She loved to be outside even when the squirrels teased her in the backyard. She also rode beautifully in the car and was a good buddy to Rudy.

GRRIN is thankful to have known Madison and to have been able to give her care and love in her final months. Look for a story written by Pam and Betty to follow.

is now a certified therapy dog. Earlier this year he passed his CGC (Canine Good Citizen) and is well versed in manners and obedience. He has started quite the selection of badges for his vest!

Bogie and Michele have been on a grand tour with his new accreditations. He's visited nursing homes, church picnics, events to promote LOAL, and his absolute favorite, the Children's Respite Therapy. The children restricted to wheelchairs love to see him and find comfort in the fact that, "he is handicapped like them."

During his downtime, Bogie (or the Bogiemeister, as he is often called) continues his water therapy on the treadmill. He loves to play with his animal siblings, go for short walks and he even runs in the backyard. He also enjoys pulling the stuffing out of pillows and meeting Michele at the door to present empty cases like a trophy.

We are so happy to hear things are going well for Bogie and Michele! Thank you for all the good you are putting into the world!

GRRIN, you have made my life complete! Thank you so much.




GEORGE 16-22 ADOPTED BY: Scott
