



Five short years ago GRRIN celebrated its 25th anniversary. Now here we are in 2021 ready to celebrate another milestone – 30 years of rescue! In 1991, three women took the idea of rescuing homeless golden retrievers and created an organization that has survived the Great Recession and most recently a pandemic.

To date, GRRIN has rescued over 1200 dogs; some years we rescued 100 dogs, some years we rescued 20, but we always had room for them thanks to our amazing foster families. There is no way we could properly thank all the volunteers and adopters for the endless hours they have

given to making rescued dogs feel secure and happy, but we will work during 2021 to honor them. Keep an eye on our Face-book page for pictures from the past!

We cannot forget two other very important parts of GRRIN's mission. Our founders determined that GRRIN should provide both educational and social opportunities for its followers and the community.

During 2020, when families were spending a lot of time indoors with their children and pets, GRRIN received several calls for help with managing their goldens' "fun-loving" and vivacious personalities. GRRIN rescue team volunteers worked with thirteen families who were considering surrendering their dogs to GRRIN. By providing training resources, compassion, and understanding (we've all had a golden with quirks!), eleven of those dogs remained with their families.

While we were challenged to provide our normal selection of social opportunities to golden lovers in 2020, we managed to hold eight in-person events and kept connected with volunteers and members through virtual meetings. Thank goodness for the virtual fundraiser! Our donors were generous, and this allowed us to pay for veterinary care that averaged nearly \$1,000 per dog. We cannot say it often enough, we are incredibly blessed to have the means to provide both necessary and extraordinary vet care, especially for our gentle senior dogs.

How will we celebrate in 2021? Currently, we are planning to hold the greatly missed Gold Rush Annual Celebration in October, and we hope to slowly bring back meet-and-greet events, along with a 30th anniversary event over the summer. Stay tuned for details about our upcoming Annual Member meeting scheduled Sunday, April 25th.

Thank you to everyone who has supported GRRIN over the last 30 years. The dogs wouldn't have their loving homes and life-saving veterinary care without you! We look forward to celebrating in person during 2021. We can't wait to see all the beautiful goldens wagging their tails and escorting their humans!

CASEWORKER COORDINATOR NEEDED

We have been without a Caseworker Coordinator for several months now, and we hope someone will step forward and volunteer to be in charge of training new caseworkers and assigning caseworkers for new dogs coming into GRRIN. That person should be a current caseworker or someone willing to be trained as one.

The most important duty of the caseworker is to keep an accurate file of the dog's paperwork. Second, and just as important, is to visit and get to know the dog while it is in foster care. You work with the foster family and the adoption coordinators to find the best match when the dog is ready for adoption.




IN MEMORY OF KEN VETTER

Ken and Rita could also be seen at GRRIN's annual meetings and yearly Gold Rush celebrations with friendly smiles and warm handshakes. We hope you enjoy a few memories our volunteers shared about Ken.

"Rita was the first person I knew who was a GRRIN member. She and I started out on the Hotline Committee together in 1992. Ken and Rita were constant attendees at GRRIN events, and it's hard for me to believe I've known them for 30 years." - Judy

"I still remember Ken giving me a big hug at every GRRIN meeting we attended. We would laugh about one of his transport missions in 2013 to Sioux Falls to pick up two breeder dogs. We had just discovered that one of them was pregnant! He rode with another long-time volunteer and I wish I could recall who it was. They had quite an adventure, praying the future mama didn't have her pups in the car." - Barb



"I crossed paths with Ken Vetter many times in the years he volunteered with GRRIN. One time in particular sticks in my memory. It was an annual meeting at Greater Lincoln Obedience in the spring of 2013. Despite our dog Josie being 11 she was still high strung in many ways. She would act silly each time I sat down to eat. In his laid-back manner Ken quietly took her leash and walked with her. She didn't mind in the least and respected his leadership. This is a poignant memory because Josie had bone cancer that had metastasized to her lungs and she died a few weeks after this." - Tammy
