SMILE FOR GRRIN



Do you want all the convenience of shopping online while making money for GRRIN?

If you're not familiar, Amazon Smile is a program through amazon.com that enables you to choose a charitable organization to support. Every time you purchase eligible products on Amazon, your chosen organization (GRRIN, of course!) will receive proceeds at no cost to you. All you have to do is go to smile.amazon.com.

The first time you visit, you will need to select GRRIN as the organization you would like to support. To do this, find "Or pick your own charitable organization" on the lower right hand side. You can search for GRRIN by typing in "Golden Retriever Rescue in Nebraska." You only need to do this once. In the future, Amazon will remember that you want your shopping to support GRRIN.

After that, all you have to do is make sure you go to smile.amazon.com (instead of www.amazon.com) every time you shop on amazon. Everything will look and function the same, but GRRIN will receive money every time you shop!

WE NEED INTAKE COORDINATORS

"You can't change a dog's past, but you can rewrite the future."

Are you interested in making a BIG difference in a dog's life? We have the volunteer opportunity for you!

GRRIN needs two to three intake coordinators to facilitate the initial phase of rescue, bringing a surrendered dog into GRRIN. Intake coordinators have the opportunity to work with the special people that have decided to trust GRRIN with their beloved golden. We are one of the first GRRIN volunteers that potential surrendering owners have contact with.

Veteran intake coordinators will train new volunteers to:

- Contact surrendering owners and learn more about their Golden
- Invite a GRRIN intake volunteer to meet and assess the incoming dog
- Gather records from the dog's current veterinarian
- Alert the foster coordinators we have an incoming dog
- Collaborate with the Rescue Chair if GRRIN is not a good fit for an incoming dog
- Invite a GRRIN transport volunteer to bring the new dog into rescue

Skills we recommend:

- Willingness to work with surrendering owners in a nonjudgmental fashion
- Ability to complete Word docs, use Google Drive and check email regularly
- Comfortable talking to new people, asking questions about their dogs, and listening to their stories

All GRRIN volunteers work remotely and we provide opportunities to meet in person and find support from other volunteers! The time commitment for intake coordinators is flexible, but averages 6-8 hours per dog. Coordinators take turns working each incoming dog. The current coordinators manage one to two dogs per month.


We also received a lovely memory from a GRRIN volunteer:




ROCKY 22-18 ADOPTED BY: Carol
