2022 IN REVIEW

GRRIN wants to send a huge THANK YOU to everyone who worked so hard to rescue GRRIN dogs in 2022.

Here are some statistics about the work that was accomplished last year:

- We carried over 8 dogs from 2021 that were adopted in 2022
- We fostered 31 new dogs
- That means 31 new intakes, 31 transports, 31 dogs to casework and foster and get to their "furever" homes!

Of the total 39 dogs:

- 19 Male
- 20 Female
- 6 males were intact
- 7 females were intact

Dog ages:

- 11 were less than 1 year
- 11 were 1-3 years
- 11 were 4-7 years
- 6 were 8+ years

Where are the dogs now?

- 29 adoptions
- 1 rainbow bridge
- 1 permanent foster
- 8 dogs currently in foster care

How did we find adoptive families?

- 45 home visits completed
- 5 of those were home visits for foster or adopt/foster
- 41 families dropped out after an application was completed



These numbers do not reflect the care and emotion and time involved in every aspect of rescue and keeping GRRIN running. And they don't reflect the appreciation we have for all the new and veteran volunteers who made a difference in 2022. Thank you to everyone who volunteered another year, started their first year as a new volunteer, recruited a volunteer, gave one hour or a hundred...you all matter to each of those 39 furry faces.



KODA'S WEEKLY VISIT

Koda the 100-pound golden doodle knows when it's time....time to go to visit the residents of a local post-acute rehab/long-term care facility in Bellevue – Hillcrest Health and Rehab. It usually starts with a good brushing along with a few sprays of doggy deodorant, two "greenies" to freshen his breath, and then Koda and his owner are off! Koda gets so excited on the 30-minute car ride there, knowing that his afternoon will bring petting, cuddling, and smiles all the way around!

Koda and his owner, Laura, visit Hillcrest Health and Rehab once a week. It is rewarding for the residents as well as Koda and Laura. Even staff members know Koda by name and many of them also enjoy a stress-relieving cuddle and pet during his visits.


A typical visit entails strolling the halls and stopping to visit anyone who is interested in spending time with a dog. When Koda enters a resident's room, he will generally go straight to the elder and put his head in their lap, as if to say "pet me." There are smiles and hugs.



Most residents know Koda by name and remember him. This almost always leads to a lively discussion about dogs – it is such easy and natural progression. One resident even tells everyone that Koda is her "grand-dog," and another has a box of dog treats that she spoils him with every single visit.

Pet visitation is a favorite activity at Hillcrest. Dogs, cats, rabbits, and even chickens are welcome at any of the Hillcrest senior living communities. If you are interested in pet visitation at any of the Hillcrest senior living communities, getting started is easy: complete and submit an application and copy of your COVID vaccination record; schedule a phone interview; complete a background check; and attend a formal orientation. You can find an application at hillcrestvolunteers.com. Updated pet vaccination records are required annually, and all pets must provide either a therapy animal certification or a veterinarian's recommendation letter of good behavior prior to volunteering.

Koda, at age 10 ½ years, is living HIS best life while enhancing the lives of so many older adults. They say that pet visitation has been shown to reduce anxiety and stress and lower heart rate and blood pressure for our elders, but it is not only beneficial for the residents. A retired teacher, Laura loves these weekly visits as much as Koda does.

Thank you so much to everyone who renewed their membership for 2023 and made donations to GRRIN! Don't miss the list of GRRIN supporters on page six of this newsletter. We are overwhelmed with their generosity. Donations from the annual membership drive allow us to provide both necessary and extraordinary vet care each year. In 2022, one-third of GRRIN's foster dogs needed to be spayed or neutered. In February, we invested over \$5,000 to save Marley from a permanent life of pain and infection (his story is on page four). "Giving is not just about making a donation; it is about making a difference!"

MARLEY'S JOURNEY

Every dog's journey through GRIN is a little bit different. Some dogs come in and can get adopted out to a loving new owner right away, but some dogs may first need a little extra care. Marley is one of those dogs who needed a little extra help, and both GRRIN and a loving foster family stepped in to give him what he needed.

In October of 2022, 10-year-old Marley was found wandering as a stray and was taken to the Midlands Humane Society in Council Bluffs. Later that month, he was picked up by a GRRIN volunteer and brought to his GRRIN foster home.

When Marley arrived at his foster home, he immediately attached himself to his foster mom. He was also curious and friendly to his foster dad, their two dogs, and even their two cats. A wonderful, gentle dog with good manners, he took very little time settling in. His foster family realized almost immediately that all of them were smitten by this sweet boy and he obviously was home.

Marley had been placed on multiple medications at the shelter, and the family continued those prescribed for an ear infection and hot spots on his skin. At his first visit to the family veterinarian, Dr. Courtney Knott at the American Animal Hospital, he was started on new medications to help with his continuing ear infection. But his ear infection just didn't seem to be getting any better. His foster family tried for four months to get his ear infection under control, but medications just weren't working. Eventually, the family took a 3-hour winter drive to Mission, Kansas on February 25th so that Dr. Eric Wilson of Mission Veterinary Emergency and Specialty could perform a total ear canal ablation and bulla osteotomy, which involved the complete removal of the ear canal and middle ear. This surgery was necessary because of the severity and duration of the infection, and also because the infection was resistant to most antibiotics.

Marley is now deaf in his right ear, but he's happier than they've ever seen him and is finally pain free. He is recovering nicely at home with his foster family with no serious adverse effects.

ANNUAL VOLUNTEER TRAINING

Thank you to everyone who attended the annual GRRIN volunteer meeting on January 22nd. We were excited to be back in person this year and back in the wonderful auditorium at the Nebraska Humane Society. The meeting started with a catered lunch of sub sandwiches, chips, and cookies and some social time. After the attendees gathered food and chatted, GRRIN officers and volunteers presented information about different volunteer opportunities available in the organization. The highlight of the meeting, though, were the demonstrations given by two long-time GRRIN volunteers on how to perform two very important jobs: transportation and assessment.

One volunteer, Dennis, demonstrated what it might be like to pick up a dog from a surrendering owner. He modeled how to interact with the owner, mentioned the importance of getting the necessary paperwork, and discussed how to transport the new foster dog to a vet checkup and then to the foster home.

Another volunteer, Cathi, walked through what it is like to go to a surrendering owner's home and do a preliminary assessment on an incoming dog. Millie, one of our blind puppies (and a puppy no longer!) was brought up to help with the demonstration. Cathi introduced the attendees to the checklist she uses, and she showed everyone her assessment bag and all of the useful items she keeps in it to make her assessments run smoothly. She then demonstrated aspects of the assessment, such as brushing Millie, testing Millie for food aggression with treats, and asking Millie's owner Pam about her personality and behavior.

Seeing both Dennis and Cathi in action made it easy for those in attendance to imagine exactly what it would be like to volunteer in those positions and made the work seem less intimidating.
